Faith Friendship Ministries was founded in 2001, with the mission of providing housing and support services to adults of low income, particularly focusing on those with mental illness, regardless of their ability to initially pay for services. We strive to show the love of Jesus through service and support for our "family members."

What we do - The Villa is a 74 bed, state licensed personal care home. Over 85% of our residents have an income well below the poverty line.

The question has been asked...

"What would the community do without Faith Friendship services?" For many of our residents, hospitals, shelters, living outdoors and in some cases, jails, would become their housing alternatives, becoming costly to the community at large. We are one of the largest personal care homes in the state of Pennsylvania to accept low income residents. The housing and support services Faith Friendship provides is an invaluable and needed service in Lancaster County.

Please disinfect your hands with the hand sanitizer provided. At this time, there are outside areas provided for visiting.
